SS Great Britain

Step aboard the SS Great Britain with a virtual [tour](#) of the boat. The SS Great Britain is docked in Bristol and is one of the most important historic ships in the world. Read the [story](#) of the SS Great Britain and find out about the man behind the world's first great luxury liner I.K. Brunel. You can also download the SS Great Britain's interactive ship building puzzle [game](#).



Stonehenge

Stonehenge offers a live view of the stones 24/7 through the [Stonehenge Skyscape website](#). Watch the sun rise and set amongst the stones.



Fashion Museum Bath

The Fashion Museum and Assembly Rooms holds a world-class collection of contemporary and historic dress but you can browse the Dress of the Year collection from the 1960s to the present day using the attraction's online [gallery](#) and take a [3D tour of museum](#). You can also test your knowledge with an online quiz, and also download some [children's activities](#) to do at home, including colouring sheets and learning how to finger knit.



Salisbury Cathedral

Take a virtual [tour](#) inside the cathedral, where you can see the beautifully carved monuments. Using Google Street View from another [location](#) you can marvel at Britain's tallest spire which weighs 6,500 tons. Salisbury Cathedral has been the home to peregrine falcons on and off since 1864. The peregrine falcons are so popular that [cameras](#) were installed so that you can watch the falcons 24/7. The 2020 nesting season got off to a great start with a female falcon laying a single egg on Mother's Day.

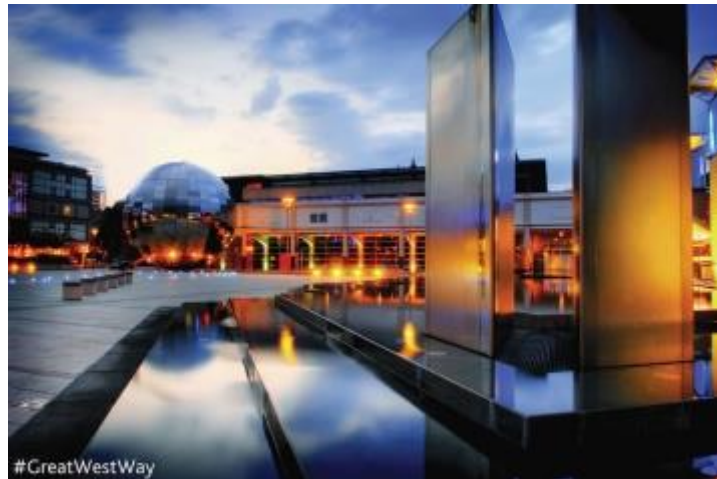
Aerospace Bristol

Longleat Safari Park has a number of [videos](#) of its adorable animals and some fun facts for all the family to enjoy.



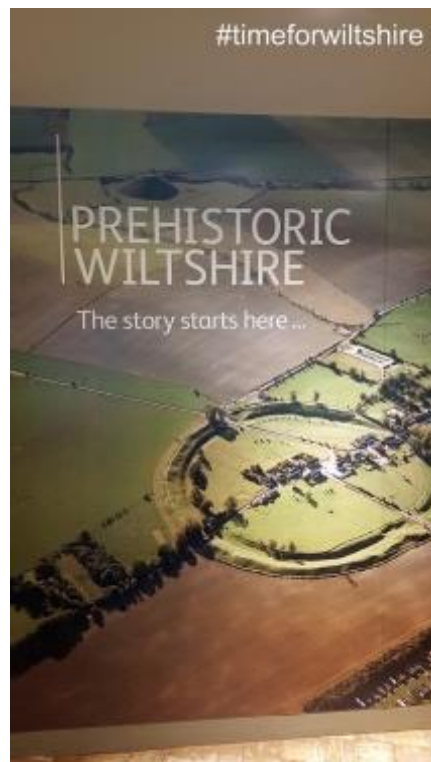
Wadworth Brewery
