

48 HOURS IN WINDSOR & ETON



It may seem surprising, but the town of Windsor is considerably older than the castle. It dates from the 7th century with royal ownership probably from the 9th century. Eton sits on the opposite bank of the River Thames from Windsor and is connected by a footbridge. It is most well-known for its famous public school, Eton College.

Day 1 AM Explore the Town

Windsor Guildhall

Designed by Sir Thomas Fitz and built in 1691. Watch the Changing of the Guard from here. windsor.gov.uk/tchanging-the-guard-p264351

Guildhall Island

Market stalls were replaced by permanent shops in the 13th century in the area now known as Guildhall Island.

Windsor & Eton Central Station

Station; fabulous shopping and eating in the Grade II listed Victorian railway station, with the replica of the GWR 3031 steam locomotive The Queen.

Day 1 PM Visit the Castle

Henry VIII Gateway

The symbolic link between castle and town. Henry VIII built his gateway in about 1511.

Queen Victoria Statue

The statue was presented to the town to mark her Golden Jubilee in 1887. Windsor was Queen Victoria's principle residence 1820-40.

Windsor Castle

Founded by William the Conqueror in the 11th century, it is the oldest and largest occupied castle in the world. Home to 39 monarch. Today the Queen spends most of her time at the Castle. rct.uk/visit/windsor-castle

Attend Evensong at St George's Chapel

The service lasts approximately 45 minutes, sung by the Chapel Choir. They perform Evensong at 5.15pm (sung daily except Wed). stgeorges-windsor.org

Day 2 Explore Eton and beyond

The Eton Walkway

A 2 mile, circular walking tour connecting 18 points of interest celebrating Eton's rich heritage. Free guides are available from the Visitor Information Centre. windsor.gov.uk/the-eton-walkway-p1405401

Red Post Box, Eton High Street

A rare pillar box from 1856, still used today. Its vertical slot for posting and fluted Doric decoration is where the name "pillar" came from. Eton was the first village in England to have a post office.

The Herschel Observatory, Eton

Sir William Herschel, King George III's astronomer, correctly described the spiral structure of our Milky Way Galaxy. He lived in Datchet, Old Windsor and Slough.

Dorney Court, Dorney

The Estate has been the home of the Palmer family for over 600 years, passing from father to son. It is a Grade 1 listed building. Private group visits are available. Max 60. domeycourt.co.uk



Distances are from Windsor Castle:

Day 1: All the places are a few minutes walk from each other.

 $\mbox{\bf Day 2:}$ Eton Walkway starts at Windsor Bridge (0.4 miles, 8 mins). The full Walkway is 2 miles.

Dorney Court is 7.1 miles, 16 mins. To join a **French Brothers Boat**, cross back over the Bridge to Windsor and it is a 2 minute walk along the Promenade. **Maidenhead Heritage Centre** 7.1 miles, 18 mins. **Frogmore** 2.3miles, 7 mins.
